## HOLY TRINITY STUDENTS VISIT FRATERNITE NOTRE DAME



The 7th and 8th grade students from Holy Trinity School took a field trip recently to visit the French Order, Fraternite Notre Dame in Marengo, Illinois. Founded in 1977 by Bishop Jean Marie, Fraternite Notre Dame is a Traditional Catholic Religious Order, made up of bishops, priests, deacons, religious friars, missionary or contemplative religious nuns who put the Gospel into practice by performing charitable works.

The Sisters gave the students a tour of the church which was hand-built by volunteer workers. Students taking French were able to have their tour conducted in both English and French. Mrs. Lori Dvorak, Holy Trinity's foreign language teacher, said, "It was very exciting for the students to have heritage French speakers to interact with throughout their afternoon visit." During the visit, the Sisters gave the students an informative tour of the facility where they make baked goods that they sell to raise money to help the poor. The students were particularly moved by the soup kitchen that the Sisters organize for the poor. The Sisters feed the homeless in Chicago, and donate baked goods that remain from the daily sales. "The students had the great blessing of prayer time in English and French, music ministry, and an authentic French lunch prepared by the Sisters. It was a great example of the humble, compassionate servants these wonderful women are in Christ," said Mrs. Dvorak.

## 7TH GRADE STUDENT MEDALS IN MATH COMPETITION
